

This document aims to provide an overview of Cedar International School's plan to return to normal operations by January 2018. The plan is subject to gaining sufficient support, and dates may be subject to change.



Phase One: There are approximately 5000 children in the BVI in desperate need of a safe place, constructive activity, and a hot meal. The phase one plan is to use Cedar for the benefit of both Cedar students who have not evacuated, and children from the wider community. Some will have the ability to pay fees, albeit greatly reduced. Many won't be able to. With sufficient support we hope to cater for up to 250 children on a daily basis. In order to retain our teachers, and keep the skills and resources in place for a January opening, it is crucial that funding is secured for this interim period.

On offer will be structured learning for all age groups, physical education and sports, arts and music, technology, gardening and community service, as well as counselling and assistance to help the children process their experience. This provision will not only be of great benefit to the children, but will enable their parents to go about the important business of rebuilding their lives and careers. We are also hoping to provide a free hot meal every day to all children who attend.

Phase Two: In January 2018, Cedar aims to resume its normal IB curriculum offering classes to all previously enrolled students who wish to return, and any new students who wish to enrol where there is space.

The January start is deemed ideal for several reasons. It provides additional months for the island's infrastructure to recover, allowing many displaced families to return. January coincides with the start of the 2nd term at most schools, allowing those students who have spent their first term in schools abroad the chance to return to Cedar with minimal disruption. This gives the Cedar teachers and staff who have been displaced and had to evacuate a chance to normalise their lives and return to the BVI so they can be ready to go for January. We are pleased to say we anticipate near full retention of our staff.
